

Risk = likelhood x consequence



- 1 Low consequence minor injuries requiring first aid such as grazes or minor
- 2 medium consequence an injury requiring further medical assisstence such as cuts needing stiche
- 3 high consequence major injury such as amputation, dislocation of bones or death
- 1 low risk it unlikely that the event will happen
- 2 medium risk it's fairly likely that the event will happen
- 3 high risk it's very likely an event will happen
